Attorney responds on behalf of two former workers in suit

The attorney representing two former employees of Moff & Associates on Court Street responded to allegations his clients did anything prohibited, as both sides pursue a civil lawsuit in U.S. Middle District Court.

"The allegations in James O. Moff III's complaint are false," said Kevin Galbraith, principal of Galbraith Law Firm, New York, New York.

"We will ultimately seek dismissal of the case, once all the evidence has been received by the court," he said.

Amy Baker and Tamara Pavlov received professional guidance concerning how to leave Moff & Associates without taking any prohibited client or firm information with them, according to Galbraith.

Moff, a financial planner and retirement specialist, sued the ex-employees alleging they provided confidential and protected information to a competitor for their own financial gain.

"There were no employment contracts, let alone non-compete or non-solicit agreements between them and Moff & Associates, and they have always handled confidential client information with care and discretion," Galbraith asserted.

Baker and Pavlov put their careers on the line as they disassociated from Moff & Associates as a result of Moff's "unethical business practices," which will soon come to light through this litigation and in other venues, according to the attorney.

"Going forward, they will reserve further comment for court filing," Galbraith said.
